## **Bathroom Cool Tool**

Expectations: Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Safe

Objective: To keep all children safe during bathroom use.

Expectations	Specifics
Be Respectful	<ul> <li>Respect the privacy of others</li> <li>Quietly wait your turn</li> <li>Get in and out as quickly as possible</li> </ul>
Be Responsible	<ul> <li>Flush the toilet</li> <li>Leave no trace</li> <li>Report problems to the teacher</li> </ul>
Be Safe	<ul> <li>Wash hands with soap</li> <li>Use 1-2 squirts of soap</li> <li>Use 1-2 squares of paper towel</li> <li>Keep 2 feet on the floor</li> </ul>

## **Activities:**

Model-Presenter demonstrates positive behavior in all areas using examples and NON-examples.

**Be Respectful--**Demonstrate respecting privacy of others (i.e. no peeking under doors, etc), getting in and out as quickly as possible, quietly waiting turn.

**Be Responsible--**Demonstrate reporting problems to a teacher (only BIG problems), flushing the toilet (not making a big deal if the toilet is not flushed), and Leave no trace.

Be Safe--Demonstrate washing hands with soap, using 1-2 squirts of soap, and 1 square of paper towel.

## Classroom Teaching Activities/Instruction:

- 1. Classroom teacher reviews specific behavioral expectations for bathroom expectations as listed above.
- 2. Discuss with the students what good manners look like in the bathroom and why it is important for yourself and others to use them.
- 3. If students are unable to demonstrate bathroom expectations, the classroom teacher will take students to the bathrooms to practice.

## **Building Wide Follow-Up/Reinforcement Activities:**

- Verbally praise students who follow appropriate bathroom expectations.
   Distribute Wildcat Cash to students who follow appropriate bathroom expectations.
