Sick Student Protocol

Since we are now in the cold and flu season, we would like to review with you several points regarding sick children at school. Healthy children are the best learners so we want everyone to be as healthy as possible.

If your child is sick, please keep them at home. Sometimes you may be unsure whether you should send your child to school or not. Some reasons you should keep your child at home include:

- Oral temperature above 100.0, or has had a temperature above 100.0 in the past 24 hours.
- Coughing frequently or has a productive cough (is coughing up phlegm).
- Had diarrhea or vomiting in the past 24 hours.
- Is complaining that his/her ears or throat hurt.
- Is very tired because of being up during the night with any of the above symptoms.
- Is just "not feeling good" or is acting sluggish.
- **Covid + students must isolate for 5 days from the start of symptoms. Testing is no longer mandatory for ill students.**

We use the 24 hour rule. No fever, vomiting, and/or diarrhea for 24 hours before attending school.

If your child develops signs of illness at school, you or your emergency contact(s) will be contacted to come and take them home. Please make every effort to pick up your child within the hour.

For the Love of Children

Children under the age of 10 should always walk and bike with adults. Because they have a narrow field of vision, lack depth perception, and have difficulty determining the direction of sound, they should never cross a street alone. As your young child walks or bikes with you, tell them about the safety measures you are using. Words have greater meaning when there is action involved.

Vision

Children see what is right in front of them. They lack depth perception and have not learned to look past what they see. Teach your child to stop at intersections and look down the road for moving vehicles.

Go Beyond Left, Right, Left

As children look down the road for moving vehicles, teach them to look in all directions. Start with left, right, left, then forward and behind. If they see any moving traffic, they are to wait for the vehicles to stop.

Eye Contact

Children tend to think if they see a vehicle, the driver sees them. That is not true. When your child sees a moving vehicle, teach them to **wait** for it to stop. Teach them to make eye contact with the driver and **wait** for the driver to wave them through.

Your child's first and most important teacher is you. Whether you intend to teach them or not, each and every day they are watching and learning from you.

So it is important to ask the question, "Are they learning what you want them to know?"

Continue Looking

Once a child begins to cross the street, it is important they continue to look for moving vehicles. A child should never assume a moving vehicle will stop for them even if they are in a crosswalk. It is important the child always stop for a moving vehicle. Once the vehicle is stopped they may continue walking.

Protocolo de estudiante enfermo

Dado que estamos en la temporada de resfriados y gripe, nos gustaría repasar con ustedes varios puntos relacionados con los niños enfermos en la escuela. Los niños sanos son los mejores estudiantes, por eso queremos que todos estén lo más sanos posible.

Si su hijo está enfermo, manténgalo en casa. A veces es posible que no esté seguro de si debe enviar a su hijo a la escuela o no. Algunas razones por las que debería mantener a su hijo en casa incluyen:

- Temperatura oral superior a 100,0, o ha tenido una temperatura superior a 100,0 en las últimas 24 horas.
- Tose con frecuencia o tiene tos productiva (está tosiendo con flema).
- Ha tenido diarrea o vómitos en las últimas 24 horas.
- Se queja de que le duelen los oídos o la garganta.
- Está muy cansado por estar despierto durante la noche con cualquiera de los síntomas anteriores.
- Simplemente "no se siente bien" o actúa con lentitud.
- **Estudiantes Covid+ deberán aislarse por 5 días desde el inicio de síntomas. Las pruebas ya no son obligatorias para los estudiantes enfermos.**

Usamos la regla de las 24 horas. No tener fiebre, vómitos y/o diarrea durante las 24 horas anteriores a asistir a la escuela.

Si su hijo presenta signos de enfermedad en la escuela, se comunicará con usted o su(s) contacto(s) de emergencia para que lo lleven a casa. Por favor haga todo lo posible para recoger a su hijo dentro de una hora.

Si necesita cambiar su información de contacto de emergencia, comuníquese con la oficina de la escuela. Los contactos de emergencia se pueden ver en su cuenta de Family Access.

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
